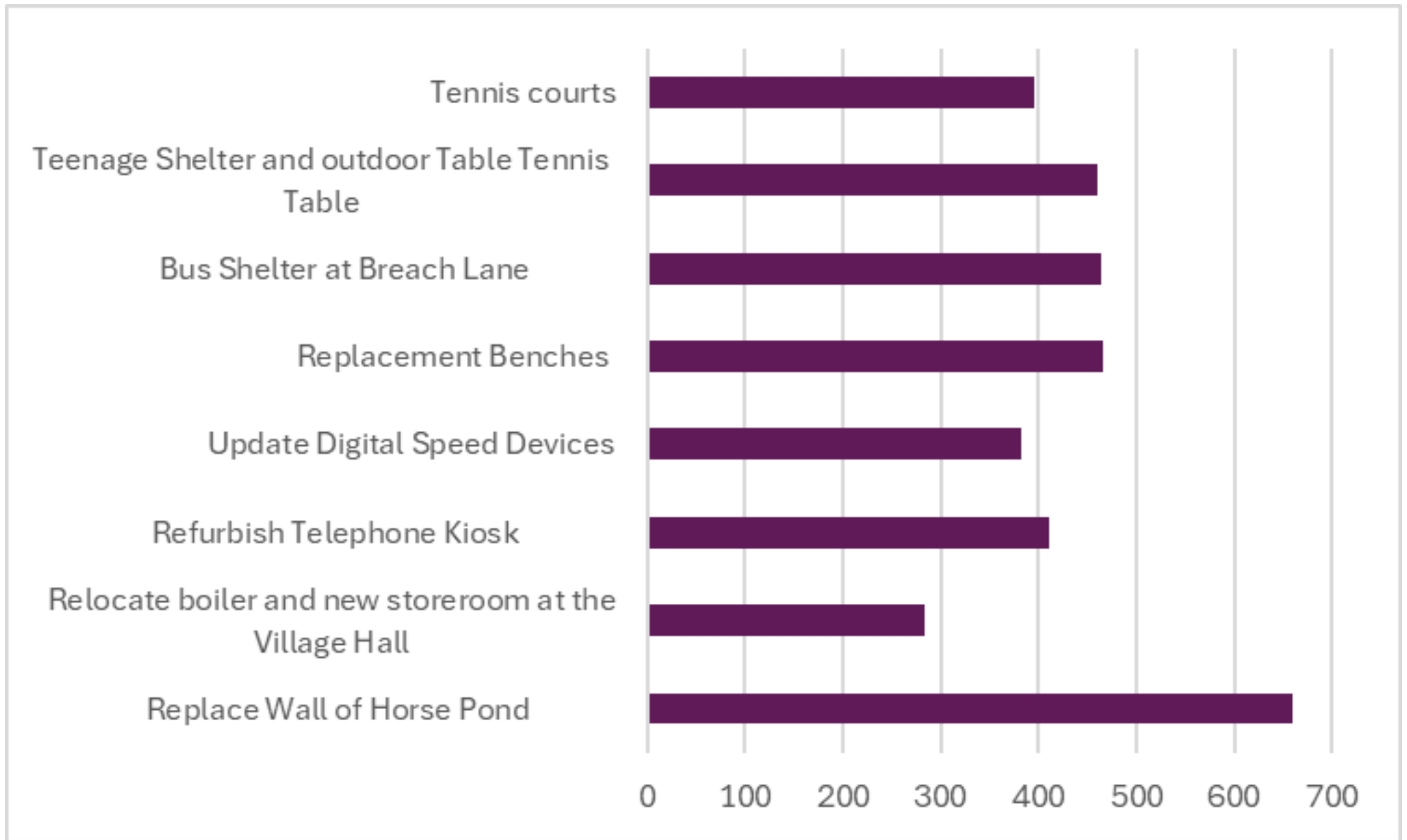


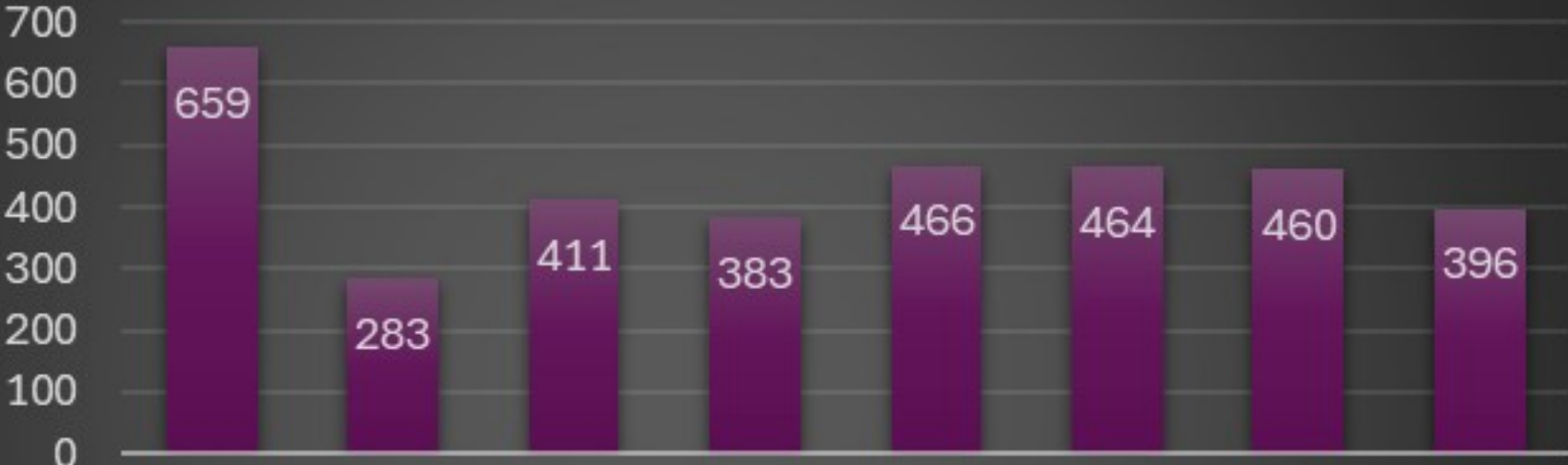

These figures are gained with priority 1 receiving 10 points, going down numerically with 10 receiving 1 point

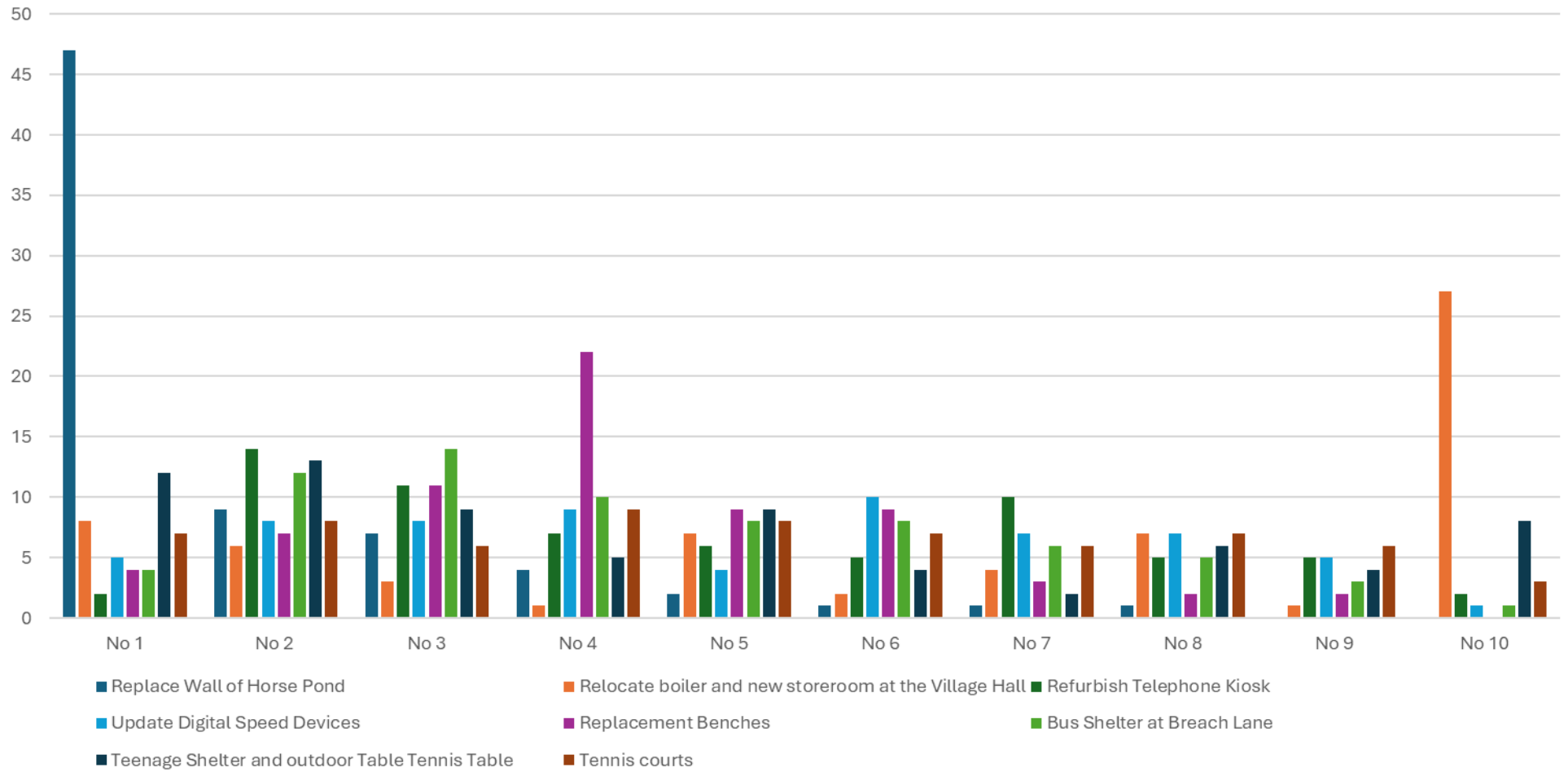


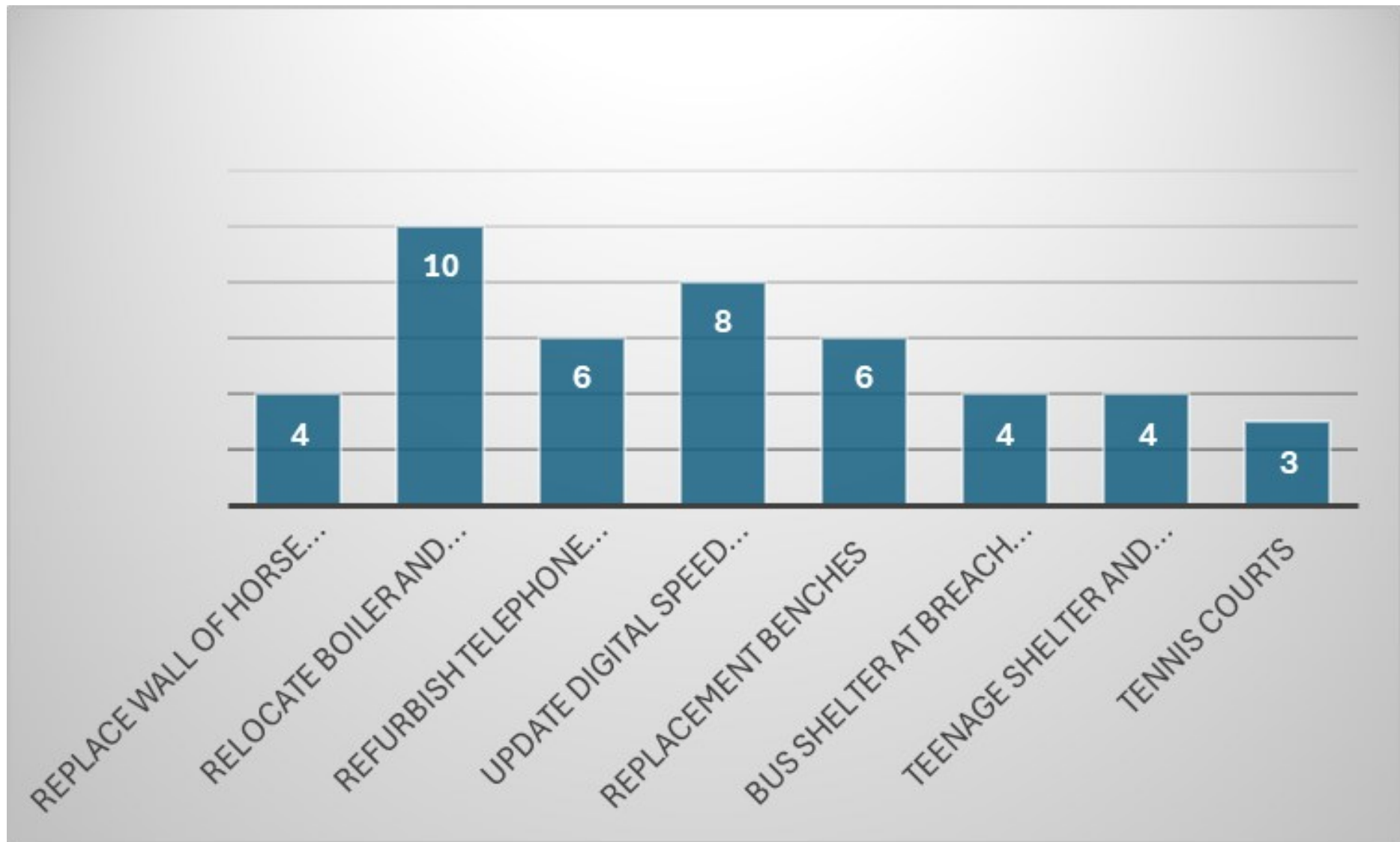
Cumulative Total

This chart shows where no vote was cast as those completing the survey did not want the project at all

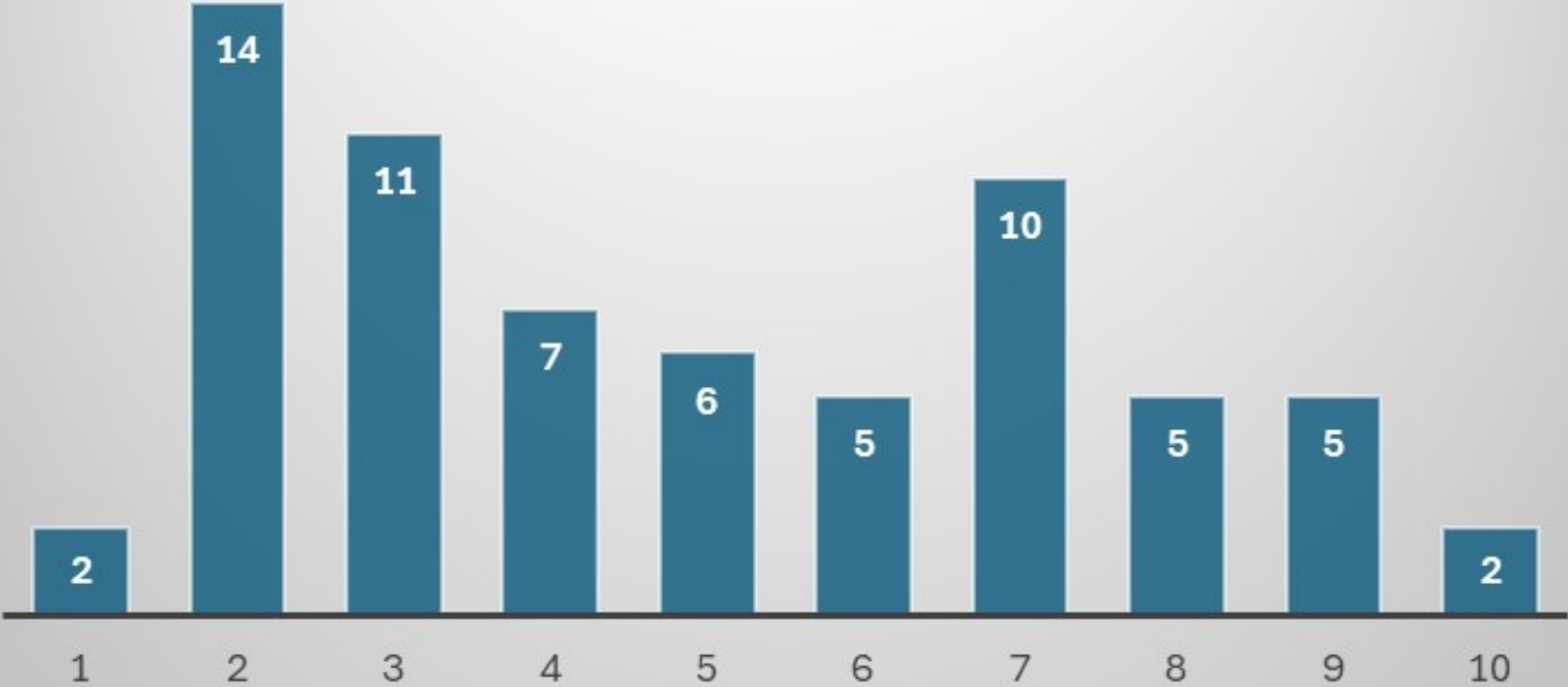

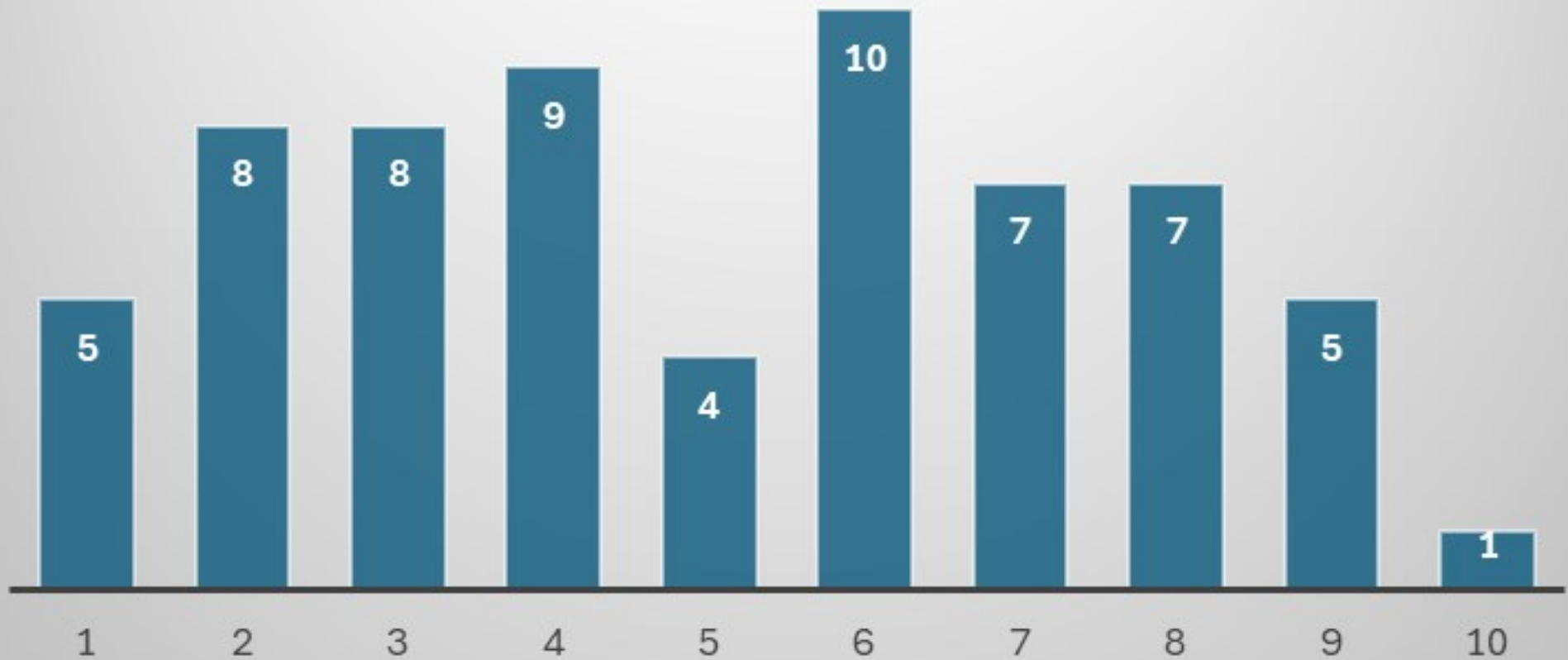
Relocate boiler and new storeroom at the Village Hall



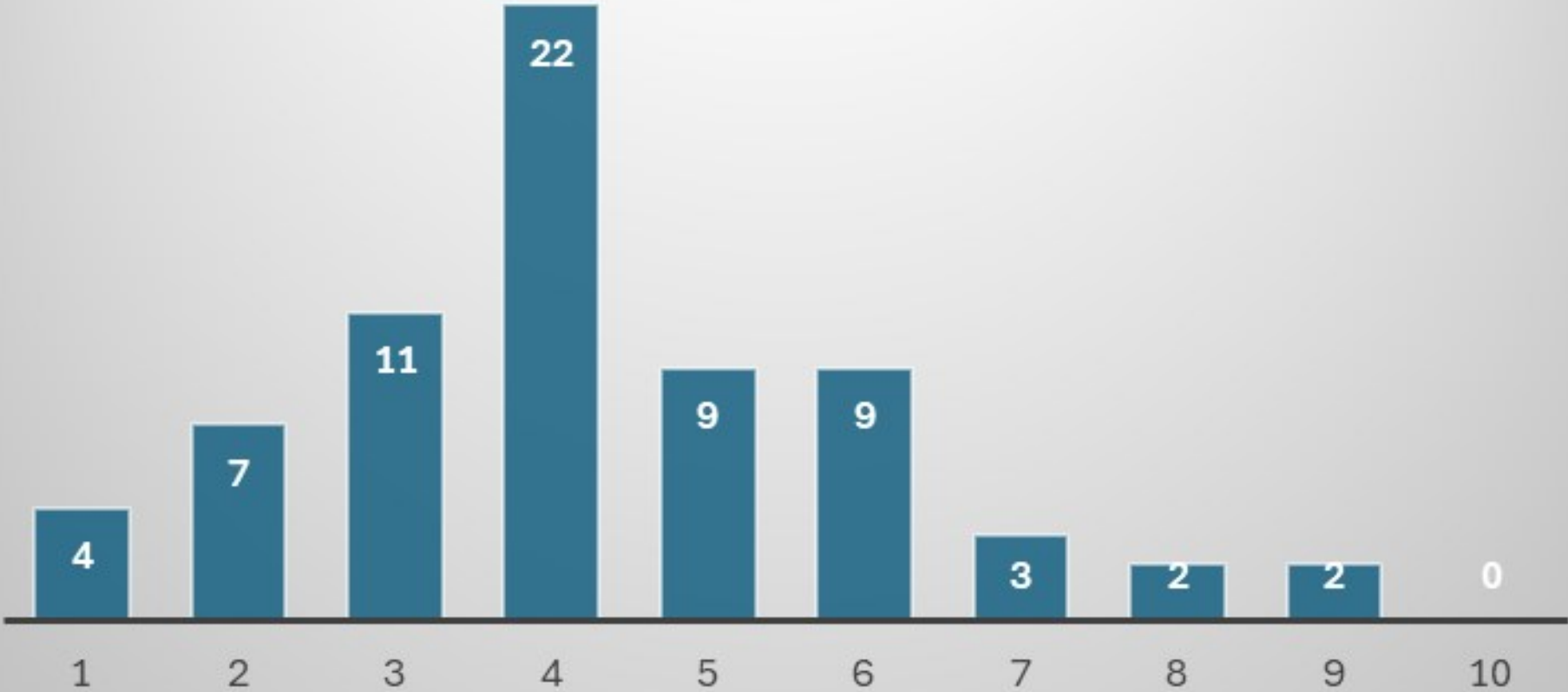
Refurbish Telephone Kiosk



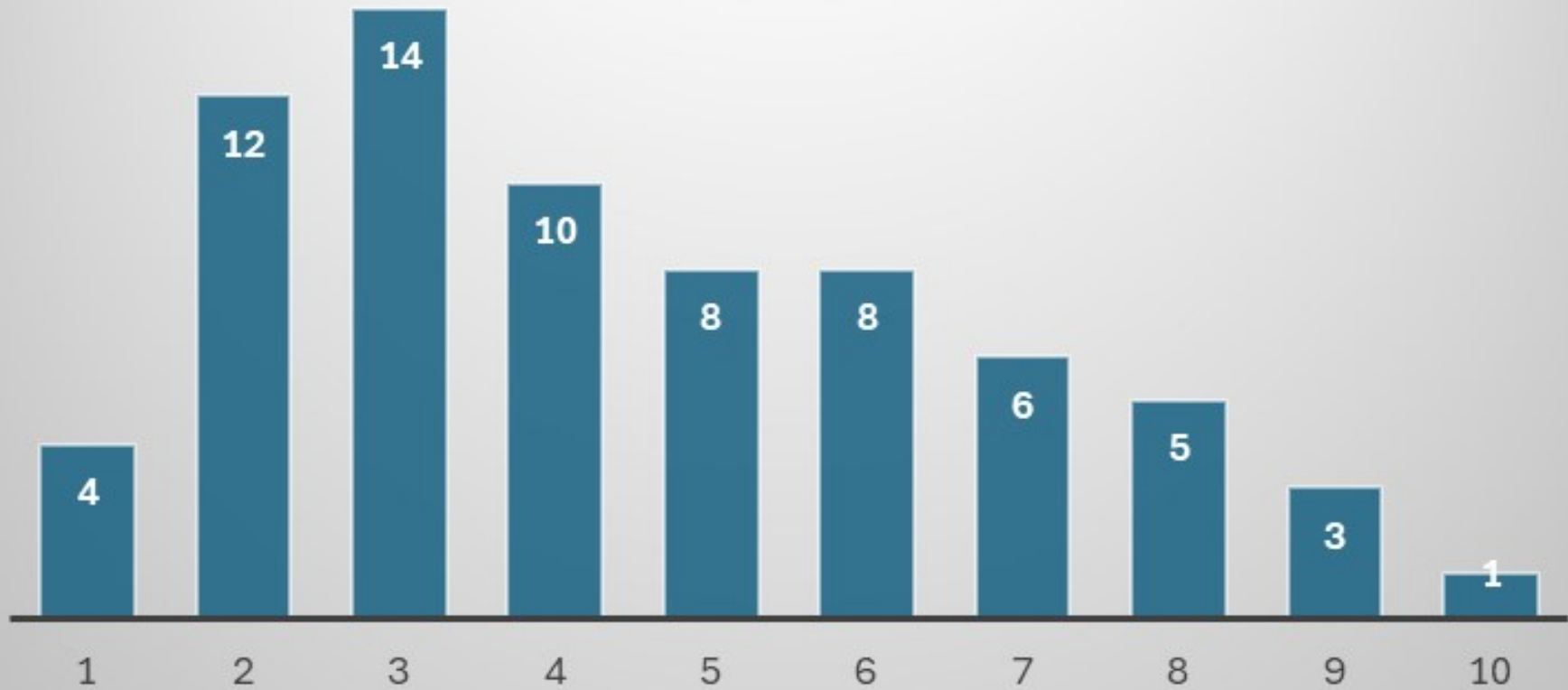
Update Digital Speed Devices



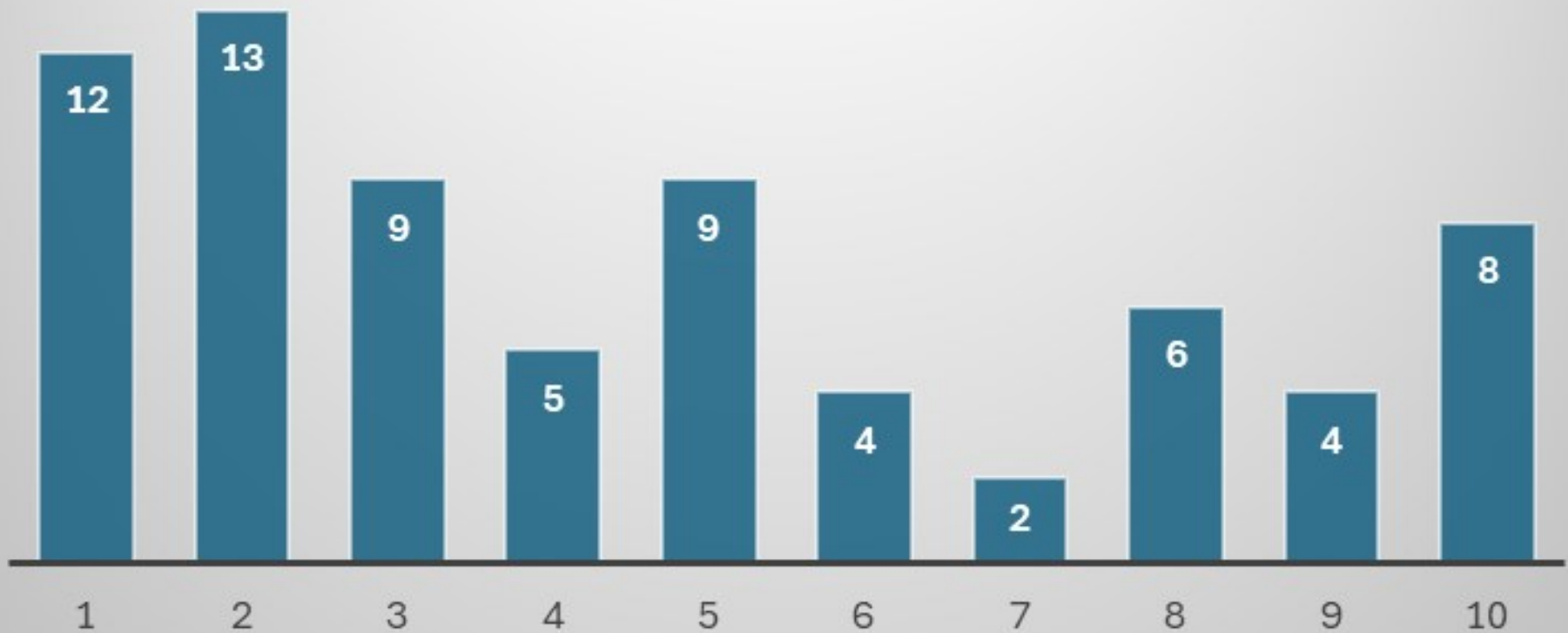
Replacement Benches



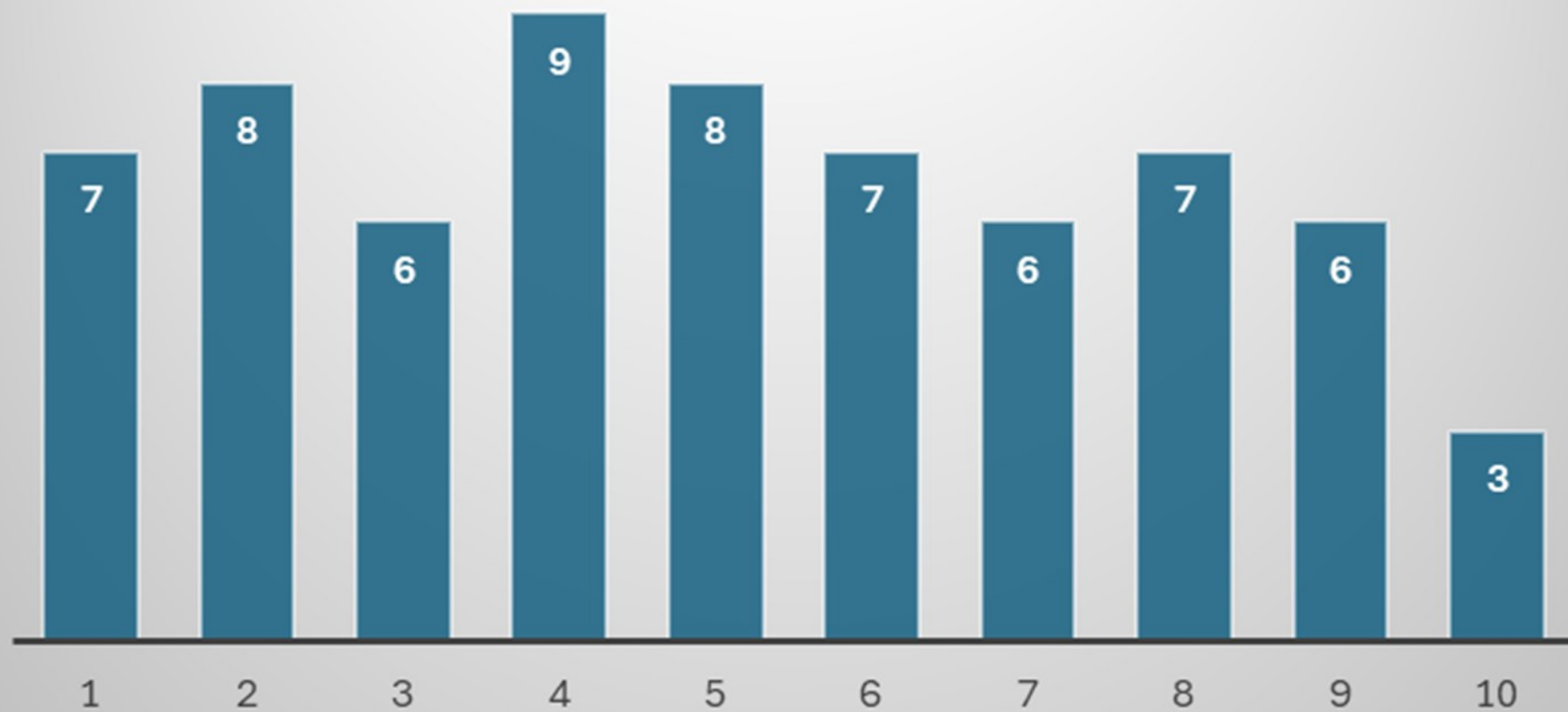
Bus Shelter at Breach Lane

Additional Comments Received

A space for regular mobile catering vendors I'm unsure if the parish council can facilitate this but I know both Bramley and Sherfield park have weekly mobile catering fish and chips pizza options. Depends on where it is sited perhaps the parish council could benefit from rental income from the space.

Considering how fortunate we are with the large village green. I wondered if perhaps some of the funds could go to supporting a study to investigate options for how we might optimise the biodiversity of the green. This could contribute other projects for future CIL plans. I know Basingstoke and Deane borough council have a diversity strategy but I have not seen more local considerations – they may have more resources that could support. Any developments could help protect the green in future and offer opportunities for expanding the green to the community e.g. small, protected areas to help specific environments develop this might facilitate, establishing a nature walk with educational aspects for the community and open up partnerships with local schools.

I'm not aware of the plans to refurbish the telephone box however I'm aware of other communities repurposing them as a book library. I've seen specifically a kid's book library exchange have good success in a number of small villages.

The CIL is a large amount of money compared to overall parish budget so it would be really good to see additional funding is spent in the best possible way.

Take down the football pavilion and extend parking it's just become a storage Hut

Who's going to look after the telephone kiosk once it's refurbished.

The village hall is a registered charity. It has had many grants from the PC and still is not run properly. It's nearly impossible to book the hall I would have thought that the priority would be to get the bookings and invoice system in better order.

A new bus shelter at Breach lane needs a stronger case and picture of what is proposed.

Are the existing digital speed services used enough to justify another unit, information the use of the present system should be provided, has there been a change in policy in the frequency of deployment with the speed signs. The existing is hardly heavily used.

Have the Youth of the village been consulted about what they think would be best for them? They find their usual all-weather meeting place the cricket pavilion very convenient especially as their bikes motorcycles and cars have easy access largely out of view, few neighbours. There is no photo or illustrations of the proposed shelter have been offered yet many of these installed by others would be entirely out of keeping with the village green. Condescending assumptions about the needs wishes and desires of these groups in the village without consultation with those groups do not make a sound basis for the project. Whilst it might be convenient to offload small projects from normal PC expenditures to CIL such as replacement benches and the telephone kiosk these should not justify a very high priority nor should those who are just wishful thinking.

Major capital projects Horsepond, boiler, tennis courts should be considered against each other not against a myriad of small modest and nice to have projects. These other projects can be introduced later once the big items have been considered.

Large items such as the refurbishment of the infrequently used tennis courts need stronger justification. Better to have a big debate on what should be done with the courts as they receive very little support from parishioners.

Village hall should get no PC funds until its books are independently audited and managed professionally.

To make permanent the temporary car park used at the fete. To improve parking for football matches.

More efficient booking service for the village hall to maximise usage and reforms.

Strategic Street lighting on Reading Rd and Goddard's lane.

Children's play area ground uneven and unsafe – accident waiting to happen high priority to resurface with safety tarmac.

The playground should be laid all over with matting, the ground is very uneven and it's just a matter of time before a child hurts themselves twisted/broken ankle

A shelter not a table tennis table

village hall is regarded as an amenity for the village but you still have to pay to use it. As it is nothing to do with the PC and runs a charity not in favour of supporting it at all.

I note the typical estimated cost is almost precisely 10% higher than funds available how about assigning 90% of the estimated cost to each project and doing them all? Or dropping the digital speed devices and replacement benches don't need them.

I can't understand why the PC paid £30,000 for playground apparatus which 1) isn't used and 2) doesn't bring any money in and consider £60,000 to replace the tennis courts minimum usage and income but doesn't want to support the village hall despite all the benefits it brings to the village. Unless decisions are based on the vindictive views of one self-serving councillor.

First choice would be money towards the church roof.

Why spend more money on the village hall?

Did the village hall kitchen ever get used?

It seems a lot has already been spent on updating the village hall spend the money on something else.

Outdoor exercise equipment would be better than a teenage shelter and table tennis a greater range of age groups could use the exercise equipment.

No more money to them (with an * at the Boiler and storeroom at the Village Hall)

Relocating the boiler and storage at the village hall does not provide good value to the vast majority of the parish particularly as it's near impossible to book the village hall leading to many bookings in neighbouring villages.

Install outdoor dog wash shower at the car park or cricket pavilion or both would be hugely beneficial for those walking our dogs in the winter to get the mud off before we go home.

Dog enrichment area i.e. a tunnel large pipe, weave poles, 6 or 12 of the short fence post like the ones already around the green wood work jumps small A-frame etc install some picnic tables perhaps at the edge of the cricket green football green.

What happened to the proposal for an outdoor gym?

why isn't the outdoor gym and nature trail on this list?

Children's play area replace grass between equipment with recycled shredded tyres or similar

playground maintenance the new swings are graunchy, there are muddy patches that could be paved over etc.

Don't think adult fitness equipment is a good investment.

A new football pavilion

Improve display boards information history etc. Walking cycling connection with Bramley.

Repair pavements outside village hall and shop/salon

The Village Hall should focus on improving their core service which has been letting people down for a number of years. upgrading the booking and invoicing system would not only address this issue but also boost their finances.

Replace grass around the play area with recycled car tyres.

No more parish funds should be allocated to the village hall.

Only ranked five of the eight options provided as I do not believe the other three options should be considered these are replace boiler for the village hall update speed devices replacement benches other projects I would like to see our demolition of the old football pavilion and erect a replacement shed to provide power supply for events on the green and a mounting surveillance camera possibly combined with teenage shelter an outdoor table tennis. A fitness trail of exercise equipment around the green. Discussion of the concrete store with natural wooden panels.
